Every journey has a beginning. That's why our placement test (also called the ACCUPLACER) is important to your success; it gauges your starting point on your college path.

Schedule Your Placement Test

When you call to schedule your placement test, have your high school GPA available, as well as PARCC, SAT and/or ACT Scores.

Prepare for Your Test

Take Your Test

- Arrive 10 minutes prior to your scheduled testing time.
- Cumberland students report to the Learning Commons on the Cumberland Campus.
- Bedford students report to Student Services at the Bedford County Campus.
- Bring your official photo ID.
- Bring a calculator (if you have one) or use one of ours.
- Relax and do your best.

PAYING FOR COLLEGE

Payment Information, Financial Aid, & Scholarships

91% of all ACM Students receive financial aid and **over \$1 million** is given in scholarships annually.

Payment Information

After you sign up for classes, you will receive a bill in the mail. Payment arrangements must be made by the payment due date for each semester to avoid being removed from your classes. There are 3 payment options:

1. Receive an official “Offer Letter” from Financial Aid that covers your total tuition and fees. If you are receiving aid for the first time, you must also request a final high school transcript be sent to the Admissions Office.

If you are accepting Federal Student Loans, you must go to studentaid.gov and:

- Complete your Master Promissory Note (MPN)
- Complete Entrance Counseling
- Complete the Annual Student Loan Acknowledgement

2. Sign up for the NelNet Automatic Payment Plan through Self-Service for your full balance due or your net balance due after Financial Aid.
3. Pay your bill in full.

Refund Information

If you drop classes before they begin, you will receive a full refund, less any nonrefundable fees. After classes begin, there is a specific refund period (three weeks for the full term fall and spring semesters) where you will receive an 80% refund. Please refer to the college calendar for specific refund dates for each term. If you drop classes after the refund period, there is no refund and you must pay **all tuition and fees**.

Financial Aid: Easy as 1...2...3!

1. Complete the FAFSA at <https://studentaid.gov>

- This is your application for federal and state financial aid, available beginning October 1 for the next school year. To be eligible for Maryland State scholarships complete the FAFSA on or before March 1. ACM’s Federal School Code is 002057.
- Sign your FAFSA using your FSA ID – apply at <https://studentaid.gov>. This serves as your electronic signature on the FAFSA and gives access to other government education websites. One of your parents may need an FSA ID, if applicable.

2. Monitor your ACM Student Email

- Your ACM Student Email account will provide important information necessary to complete your file.
- It is important to check this regularly, as this is our primary method of communication.

3. Track your Progress on Self-Service

- Review your Checklist on your Financial Aid Homepage and complete all necessary items, including ACCEPTING, SIGNING, and SUBMITTING your official “Offer Letter”.
- If accepting Federal Student Loans, additional required items will appear on your Checklist – be sure to revisit it!

After registering for classes, you will use your ACM email address and password to log into D2L/Brightspace at allegany.brightspace.com
