DISPENSARY

Dispensary Technician I

(DHR870)

Do you have an interest in wellness, and would you enjoy providing excellent customer service in a medical dispensary? If so, you may be interested in a career in the new and rapidly growing medical cannabis industry. There are already over 100 dispensaries in Maryland, and demand for qualified Dispensary Technicians is increasing. This course is the first of two in a series and provides the training you need to work in a medical cannabis dispensary. You will learn an overview of the Dispensary Technician's role, practice professional skills and responsibilities involved in day-to-day operations, and learn Maryland regulations for dispensary operations including security, inventory management, software types, recordkeeping, and patient management from check-in to check-out, and follow-up. Class sessions are conducted in Zoom and Canvas; you will receive links and instructions one week before the class begins. Register for both DHR 870 and DHR 871; successful completion of both classes is required to earn the Dispensary Technician certificate. 30 hours, 3.0 CEUs.

SECURITY GUARD TRAINING

Security Guard Training- Entrance

Level (PRO400)

As of January 1, 2025, Security Guards in Maryland are required to be certified according to the state's legal requirements and MD Business Occupations and Professions Code § 19-412 (2024). While training has always been in place, training approved by Maryland Police Training and Standards Commission is now a requirement to apply for the mandated Security Guard certification. This training is for Security Guards currently employed or individuals seeking employment by Maryland Security Guard Agencies or Employers and does not include certification for chemical agents, handcuffing, or firearm techniques.

This initial training is required for Maryland Security Guard Certification and is valid for three years. In-service classes will be available and are required to renew the certification. Additional courses to complement certification are available such as CPR and First Aid. Please contact dumstot2@allegany.edu or 301-784-5365 with questions.

This initial training is 12 hours total classroom time, 6 hours each day. All course materials are included in the cost.

Training includes:

- relevant criminal law
- the appropriate use of force
- the use of alternatives to force
- the use of de-escalation techniques
- promoting appropriate interactions with individuals who are under 18 years of age; have behavioral health or other disabilities; or are in crisis.

Anyone who wishes to be certified as a Security Guard in Maryland, must meet, and maintain the following qualifications:

- be at least 18 years old
- meet the standards set by the Secretary
- be a current employee of or an applicant for employment with a licensed security guard agency or a security guard employer
- be of good moral character and reputation
- has not been convicted of a disqualifying crime, under § 5-101 of the Public Safety Article
- has not been convicted of a crime of violence, under § 14-101 of the Criminal Law Article

DRONE

Drone Pilot Training (PRO426)

Drone Pilot Training is an 8-week course that will provide students with the skills and knowledge needed to safely and legally operate a Small Unmanned Aerial System (sUAS) commonly referred to as a drone. Further, it will provide you with the necessary information required to pass the initial Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Aeronautical Knowledge Examination and obtain an FAA sUAS Pilot's

certificate. Hands-on flying will enhance your knowledge by giving you the experience of flying a rotary-winged sUAS, which will be furnished for your use while participating in this course. This course focuses on the rules and regulations regarding the operation of the Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs) operating in the National Airspace under 14 C.F.R Part 107. You will learn the responsibilities of being a Remote Pilot in Command and using the methodology of Crew Resource Management, Aeronautical Decision Making, and Risk Management to conduct safe sUAS flight operations. This course also provides the students with classes on weather reports, basic aerodynamics, airspace use, reading aeronautical charts, airport operations, maintenance, emergency procedures, Certificate of Authorization and other pertinent information regarding the safe flight and operation of small unmanned aircraft. The course will include equal time in classroom as well as flying time outdoors and is open to anyone, regardless of skill level and recreational or commercial sUAS Piloting interest.

TRANSPORTATION

Allegany College of Maryland has partnered with Garrett College to provide Commercial Driver License (CDL) training in our region. The profession truck driving curriculum prepares students for entry-level positions in truck driving through topics like pre-trip inspection, yard skills, and over-the-road training, map reading, and log books.

Successful completion leads to DOT certification and obtaining a CDL license through the Maryland Department of Motor Vehicles. Training for Class-A is 210 hours (30 days) and Class-B is 49 hours (6 days).



Program Entry Requirements

- Must currently possess a valid (nonprovisional) license and be 18 years of age.
- Must be able to pass a Department of Transportation (DOT) physical which cannot expire during the training period.
- Drug screen which must be less than sixty (60) days old and cannot expire during the training period.
- Must communicate in the English language sufficiently, as required by the U.S. Department of Transportation.
- Must obtain a CDL Learner's Permit.
- Students are required to have a High School Diploma or equivalent.
- Students are required to take the TABE Assessment prior to enrollment.
- Students must maintain a 75% average on quizzes and tests in each class and meet attendance requirements.
- Students must participate in an Orientation and Information session.
- A \$25 non-refundable registration fee is required from all students.

Aeration of Activated Sludge, BNR and ENR Processes (PRO311)

Various technologies are used to aerate activated sludge processes, including Biological Nutrient Removal (BNR) and Enhanced Nutrient Removal (ENR) processes. Various aeration options currently used, available, and evolving for activated sludge, BNR, and ENR processes will be covered in this course. Specifically, types of aeration diffusers (mechanical, fine bubble, and membranes) and blowers (positive, multistage, single stage, and high speed) will be addressed.



The influence of MCRT and MLSS will also be addressed as to the efficiency, ease (or difficulty) and cost of aeration. Airflow rate requirements and their calculations will be discussed in depth. Diffuser fouling and scaling issues will be discussed. Finally, helpful operating hints will be provided based on experiences from operating facilities. 
