

Regalia

Academic regalia, with its distinctive gowns, hoods, and caps, reflects a tradition that dates back to the medieval universities of Europe. The cap and gown symbolize academic achievement, while the hood, lined with colors representing the graduate's field of study and institution, signifies scholarly distinction. Faculty and staff wear these garments to honor the shared pursuit of knowledge and the centuries-old customs of higher education. Today's varied colors and styles highlight individual accomplishment and the collective spirit of scholarship celebrated at commencement.

The bachelor's gown is distinguished by its long-pointed sleeves. The master's gown has longer, narrower closed sleeves, extending below the knee; the arm is passed through a slit at the elbow. Finally, the doctoral gown has a full bell-shaped sleeve with three bars of velvet and an opening faced with wide velvet bands. The velvet trim may be black or of a color indicating the wearer's learning field or the institution from which the wearer earned their highest degree.

College graduates traditionally wear black caps and gowns because black was established as the standard academic color during the 19th century when American universities sought a uniform look for graduation ceremonies, drawing from the scholarly traditions of medieval Europe. Black was considered dignified, formal, and neutral, allowing additional symbolism to be displayed through the colored hoods and trim denoting fields of study and academic achievement. Over the years, some institutions have incorporated their school colors into academic regalia. However, black remains the classic and widely recognized color for graduation gowns and caps across the United States.

Grand Marshals

The honor of serving as Grand Marshal is conferred upon a distinguished full-time Professor. The role of the Grand Marshal is to serve as the lead ceremonial official who ensures the event proceeds smoothly and with dignity. Grand Marshals lead the academic processional and recessional, and assist with coordinating the lineup and movement of graduates and faculty.

The Grand Marshals in this ceremony are Dr. Tonya Shepherd, Professor of English and Speech, and Dr. Brandon Hoover, Professor of Criminal Justice and Legal Studies.



The Presidential Medallion

The top half of the circular medallion utilizes the natural patterning in green and blue agates to create an inlaid representation of mountains and sky. The left lower quarter of the medallion features polished malachite, chosen for its resemblance to the school color of green. This slice serves as a backdrop to a sculpted gold lamp of knowledge. The opposing lower section is worked in a four-color enamel depicting portions of the Maryland state flag. "Allegany College of Maryland – Seal of the President," in gold letters within a twisted border, forms the circumference of the medallion. It is suspended from a satin ribbon and gold bail formed as a mortar board and rolled diploma.

Phi Theta Kappa

Phi Theta Kappa is the oldest International Honor Society, founded to give prestigious recognition to community college students with excellent academic achievements. Graduates participating in Phi Theta Kappa proudly display a gold stole and tassel to recognize their accomplishments as PTK student members. PTK members can also wear the PTK medallion and cords if they so desire.

Honors Program

The Allegany College of Maryland Honors Program participants complete honors-by-contract courses. Since the Honors Program is not a separate curriculum, the student may major in any one-year certificate or two-year associate degree program.

Students in the Honors Program must complete a minimum of 12 hours of honors courses with a grade of "B" or better in the course as well as on the honors project, maintain a 3.5 grade point average, and provide three hours of service to the college or the community per semester.

As a participating member of the National Collegiate Honors Council, the Northeast Collegiate Honors Council, and the Maryland Collegiate Honors Council, Allegany College of Maryland supports and encourages academic excellence.

Cords and Pins

Special cords and pins worn by graduates during today's ceremony represent academic honors, membership in honor societies, significant extracurricular activities and achievements, and/or completion of a specific academic major.

These cords are usually colorful strands with tassels draped around the graduate's neck. Each color or combination typically signifies a distinct accomplishment such as Early College student, high academic standing, participation in specific organizations, recognition for leadership, or military service.

Pins often signify students' transition from learners to professionals ready to serve in their chosen field. Pins may also signify membership in an honor society or recognition of specific leadership roles, adding further distinction to the graduate's regalia.

Wearing these symbols at graduation signifies pride, reflecting the graduate's dedication, perseverance, and contributions during their college journey.

Latin Honors

Graduates who have achieved a high standard of academic excellence are recognized with Latin Honors. The three levels of distinction are:
