The following areas of study and practice will be covered in the Spring Clinical classes (HS 170 and 190) that are taught by Cherie Snyder and Annette Clark. - 5. Helping Techniques (Person Centered, Reality, Solution Focused etc.)
- 6. Knowledge of Community Resources and Service Systems
- 7. Professionalism
- 8. Confidentiality and Ethics; HIPPA
- 9. Political/Consumer Advocacy
- 10. Mind/Body Healing and Wellness
- 11. Outcome-Based Evaluation
- 12. Group work

Course syllabus for the two required courses are included in your Supervisor's Packet. They explain in more detail about the assignments, weekly class topics, and the textbooks that are used.

The curriculum will continue to emphasize the importance of written and oral communication skills, teamwork, interpersonal skills, and a holistic approach to working with clients.
