Allegany College of Maryland proudly celebrates the inauguration of its sixth president, a leader whose vision aligns with ACM's enduring mission: to be the college of choice that transforms lives, strengthens communities, and places learners at the heart of everything we do.

Founded in 1961 as Allegany Community College, ACM has grown into a dynamic institution offering 48 two-year degree programs (AA, AS, AAS, and AAT), 31 certificate programs, and 10 letters of recognition. With a strong commitment to access, ACM serves a diverse student population, 80% of whom are first-generation college students, and 88% receive financial assistance.

ACM's reach extends across multiple locations, each designed to meet the evolving needs of our region:

- Cumberland Campus
- ► Bedford County Campus
- Gateway Center, featuring the School of Hospitality Management & Culinary Arts, Culinaire Café, and ACM's Adult Education and Literacy Services
- Western Maryland Works Training Center and Makerspace
- Bedford County Technical Center
- Garrett County Nursing Site
- Somerset Education Site at the Somerset County Technology Center

In FY 2025, ACM served over 10,000 students through credit programs and Continuing Education and Workforce Development opportunities, empowering learners and fueling economic growth across the region.

As we look to the future, ACM remains committed to shared governance, community partnerships, and the transformative power of education. Together, we will continue to inspire excellence and empower tomorrow.





DAVID R. JONES

David Jones became the sixth president of Allegany College of Maryland on January 1, 2025, bringing nearly three decades of dedicated service to his new role. His tenure is defined by strong community partnerships, transformative fundraising, and a steadfast belief in education as a driver of regional progress—advancing workforce development and expanding access through enhanced scholarship support for students.

He began his career at ACM in 1996 as an administrative assistant to President Donald Alexander. Within a year, he was named the College's director of fundraising and grant writing and later served as director of grants and development and executive director of the ACM Foundation. He became vice president of advancement and community relations in 2015, a role he held until his appointment as president.

During this 29-year span, President Jones became known for his diplomatic and caring demeanor and collaborative style of leadership. His work on behalf of students and ACM includes:

- Securing more than \$68 million in grant funding to support academic programs, athletics, campus security and safety, capital projects, community and civic engagement, facility updates and renovations, student services, and workforce development.
- Raising more than \$30 million for the College's affiliated foundations, the Allegany College of Maryland Foundation and the Bedford County Regional Education Foundation.
- Awarding over \$20 million in scholarships to students enrolled in academic or job training programs.
- Building partnerships in collaboration with ACM faculty and staff to develop and expand programs in advanced manufacturing, cybersecurity, early college, nursing, and P-TECH.

Before joining ACM, President Jones was a program specialist with the U.S. Department of Education for two years and has served as a federal grant peer reviewer for nearly three decades. President Jones earned undergraduate and graduate degrees in social science and education from Frostburg State University.

He and his wife, Elaine, a Certified Public Accountant, are the parents of three adult children, Daniel (Addie), Audrey, and Rachel, and reside in Frostburg. President Jones is deeply involved in the local community and is committed to fostering strong regional partnerships that support education, workforce development, and civic engagement.
