Colleagues,

Over the past few weeks, many of you have expressed an interest in, and willingness to receive, the COVID-19 vaccine. We are working with our local partners to allow eligible faculty and staff the opportunity to be included in the 1B tier for vaccine distribution planned over the next few weeks. Although encouraged, receiving the vaccine will be optional, and updates will be provided when they are available.

If you or your loved ones are over the age of 65, you may be able to receive the vaccine through your county's health department before it becomes available to us more broadly as College employees. Because I am in this category, I was able to get my first dose of the vaccine this morning. I will return in three weeks to receive the second dose of the vaccine.
