TRANSFER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- A student who has been attending another institution of higher education and wishes to transfer to IUP must submit an application with the application fee, official transcripts of all postsecondary educational work, and an official high school transcript.
- Transfer applications (**twelve or more postsecondary, college credits attempted**) are reviewed on the basis of college coursework completed. Transfers are required

to have at least a cumulative **2.0** GPA on a 4.0 scale (C average) from all schools previously attended for admission to most programs. Several IUP majors have special admissions requirements, check IUP's website for a list of programs.

APPLICATION DATES

Students are encouraged to apply early. Students transferring in spring are advised to apply in September and fall transfers are advised to apply between September and December.

All admissions decisions are made on a rolling basis by the Admissions Committee. Under a rolling admissions policy, applications are reviewed as they become complete. Decisions can range from automatic acceptance, to request for additional information, to other alternatives.

• GENERAL TRANSFER INFORMATION

No more than 60 credits may be accepted for transfer credit from 2-year or community colleges.

IUP will review transcripts and send students a course-by-course evaluation at the time of admission. Each course is evaluated separately. The evaluation includes a review of the description, semester hours, and grade of each course along with the applicability of the course to the student's major at IUP. However, only credits transfer, not grade-point average.

It has been the policy of the university that only courses with a "C" or higher grade will be accepted, except for two-year associate degree graduates of state-supported community colleges in Pennsylvania. No matter how many credits are transferable, the student must satisfy all of the degree requirements falling into the categories of:

- (1) University requirements
- (2) College requirements
- (3) Department requirements.

Students who have not completed English 101 or a college level Math will be required to complete diagnostic placement tests in reading English, and mathematics.

- The Online Transfer Credit Equivalency System is for reference use only. The equivalencies listed are the most current articulations and are subject to change. Official transfer credit evaluation is established through the IUP Office of Admissions. If a course is not listed in the system, it does not signify that the course will not be accepted, but means that it is not in the database. If an equivalency is listed and the earned grade is C or above, the course will transfer for admissions purpose. The course's application to the major is determined by the academic advisor.

Note:

- Specific courses may be required or recommended by colleges or major departments; see degree program outlines for specifications. Applicability of courses is dependent on a student's major.
