TRANSFER ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

WVU determines transfer admission based upon the following criteria:

A. Fewer than 24 credits of transferable credits (as determined by WVU) must meet freshman admissions standards.

1. Cumulative GPA from all college transcripts must be a minimum of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale
2. Official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended must be sent to WVU Admissions Office.
3. High school transcripts and SAT or ACT scores must be sent to WVU Admissions Office.

B. 24 or more transferable credits (as determined by WVU) must meet the following:

1. Cumulative GPA must be a minimum of 2.0.
2. Official transcripts from all colleges/universities attended must be sent to WVU Admissions Office.

MAXIMUM TRANSFERABLE CREDITS

No more than 72 credits normally may be accepted for transfer credit from two-year or community colleges. The WVU Admissions Office will select up to 72 credits that best fit the student's major,

SELECTION OF TRANSFERABLE CREDITS

Allegany College of Maryland works closely with West Virginia University to advise students in the selection of courses for transfer. Refer to the following resources for information:

APPLICATION PROCESS

Students applying for the Fall Semester should apply between September 15 and March 1. Although August 1 is the final deadline for fall transfer admission, students should apply well before that date. Those students wishing to participate in early registration and applying for financial aid, scholarships and housing should apply early. For the Spring Semester, students should apply between September 1 and December 1.

GENERAL TRANSFER INFORMATION

- All students transferring from community colleges will be required to complete the General Education Foundations (GEF) and any additional general requirements of the specific college. The new GEF was effective with all new students who began attending WVU in Fall 2016. The date you began attending ACM does not affect the GEF.
- Only credits with a grade of D or better are transferable for college level courses. Grades do not transfer.
- Only official transcripts, sent directly to the WVU Admissions Office from other colleges, will be recognized for transfer credit.
- WVU only recognizes credits earned at regionally accredited institutions. Allegany College of Maryland is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools.
- WVU will review transcripts and send students a course-by-course evaluation at the time of admission.

F8 Focus (9 credits)		
	The GEF designates 9 credits (normally 3 three-credit courses) of Focus coursework. Students work with their advisors to select three additional courses from the list of those approved for the GEF to maximize connections, incorporate additional competencies, and encourage true breadth of study. Such courses may lead to a minor or even a second major, and are intended to help students capitalize on the range and diversity of courses offered at WVU	

MAJOR COURSE REQUIREMENTS

1. Check the WVU academic catalog to obtain a complete list of courses required by each major or refer to the WVU website.
2. Refer to the Allegany College of Maryland to West Virginia University Transfer Planning Guide available in the Student Success Center for information on selected majors.
3. Consult with your advisor, the Student Success Center, or Pennsylvania Student Services for course transferability information or appropriate courses for a major. A partial list of transferable courses is available at

4. Many departments require that only courses in which a C grade or better has been earned may count toward satisfaction of major requirements. Consult the WVU academic catalog under the major requirements. A minimum of 2.0 average in the major requirements is needed for graduation. Some majors may require a higher average.
